YOUR KIT CONTAINS:

- Assorted Color Sheets of Felt Pinecone Shapes
- Chenille Stems
- Cord (for hanging)

YOU WILL NEED:

Scissors

AGE GROUP: 8 and up

PROJECT TIME: 30 minutes

EACH PERSON SHOULD HAVE:

- 2 different colored sheets of felt pinecone shapes
- 1 piece of cord
- 1- 4" length of chenille stem

PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Cut the chenille stems in half so you have 24, 4" pieces.
- 2. Have each person decide which 2 colors of felt they want to use to make his/her pinecone.

TIP: To make assembly easy, photocopy the instructions and diagrams for each person.

INSTRUCTIONS:

(Refer to the figures on the next page)

- 1. Lay your 2 felt sheets on the work surface so that they line up with Figure 1.
- 2. Punch out all the felt pinecone shapes and lay them on your work surface in the same order as Figure 2.
- 3. Make a small loop in one end of your chenille stem.
- 4. Starting with the #1 shape, thread 1 of each color on the chenille stem (see Figure 3), following the order of shapes in Figure 2.
- 5. When you are finished threading all the shapes in order (see Figure 4), make a loop in the top of the chenille stem. Thread the cord for hanging through the loop and tie a knot.
- 6. You can twist the colored shapes of the pinecone so that they overlap each other or so they are slightly separated if you prefer a fuller looking pinecone.

TIP: Once assembled, for extra sparkle add some glue to the edges of the pinecone shapes and sprinkle glitter on! Let dry. Glue and glitter sold separately.
